Speakers welcomed attendees and acknowledged the importance of the All Stakeholders Meeting as a space for broader community engagement, transparency, and shared learning across the homelessness response system.</p> | N/A |

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| <p>Leadership Council Opportunities & Community Engagement</p> | <p>Shan Robertso n</p> | <p>Shan Robertson presented an overview of current and upcoming opportunities to participate in Leadership Council governance. Topics included the 2026 Leadership Council Voting Slate, anticipated vacancies, and pathways for community members to engage in governance activities.</p> <p>The presentation emphasized the importance of diverse representation, lived experience, and community participation in strengthening governance processes. No formal action was taken.</p> | |
| <p>Federal Funding Updates & HUD Annual Competition Overview</p> | <p>Helen Eisert</p> | <p>Helen Eisert provided an overview of recent federal funding changes and their implications for local housing resources. The presentation included an overview of HUD’s Annual CoC Competition and its impact on funding allocation within Austin/Travis County.</p> <p>Presenter also highlighted opportunities for providers and community members to engage in advocacy efforts related to federal funding priorities. No formal action was taken.</p> | |

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| <p>Governance Roadmap 2025–2026 Overview</p> | <p>Shan Robertson</p> | <p>Shan Robertson provided an overview of the 2025–2026 Leadership Council Governance Roadmap, including progress updates of completed deliverables, continuing items and betterdefined roadmap items such as Diversion and PLE’s in the workforce roadmap item. Highlighted were ongoing efforts to improve clarity, effectiveness, and accountability within governance processes.</p> <p>The presentation included discussion of structural changes, such as the rationale for closing workgroups, and alternative methods for stakeholders to remain informed and engaged. Additionally, Shan highlighted the PLE Spotlight in Governance, a new initiative aimed at elevating and centering the voices of people with lived experience (PLE) in governance spaces as well as new assigned item not on roadmap (PLE Compensation Policy).</p> <p>No formal action was taken.</p> | |
| <p>Coordinated Entry Scope of Work</p> | <p>Matt Mollica, Kate Moore</p> | <p>Coordinated Entry Scope of Work (Action Item)</p> <p>Matt Mollica presented the Coordinated Entry (CE) Scope of Work and goals for the CE Redesign. The goals of the redesign include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Comprehensive Resource Connections for People Experiencing Sheltered and Unsheltered Homelessness • Supports the needs of Providers running programs in the Homelessness Response System • Informed by People with Lived Experience, centering the equity of historically marginalized populations | |

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| | | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Data informed by design and continuously evaluated to ensure impact as intended. • The presentation outlined key areas for redesign, including: • Updates to the assessment tool and core elements • Improved tools for determining eligibility and prioritization for resources • Expansion of the types of resources available and increased accessibility • Strengthened processes for managing access, referrals, enrollments, and exits across the Homelessness Response System <p>Matt also reviewed the CE Redesign process and initial benchmark goals, which include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Analysis of the current system using both qualitative input from people with lived experience and other stakeholders, alongside quantitative data • Building buy-in and identifying new resources to be linked to Coordinated Entry, including the development of operational plans for each resource • Development of a prioritization framework for Rapid Re-Housing (RRH) and Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) <p>Operational and policy-related changes were discussed, including anticipated updates to assessment, prioritization, referral, and matching processes, as well as related CoC policy and process changes. The redesign also includes plans to expand the types of resources available through CE and integrate with adjacent system partners.</p> <p>Proposed Timeline for Approval and Implementation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • February 2026: Leadership Council approval of the Coordinated Entry Scope of Work • May 2026: Analysis phase completed • July 2026: Draft prioritization framework presented to and approved by Leadership Council | |
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| | | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> October 2026: HMIS build-out and pilot of prioritization and resource matching August 2026: Pilot roll-out (analysis and testing phase) January 2027: Final CE Redesign go-live <p>Leadership Council members discussed implementation considerations, provider readiness, and alignment with ongoing CE Redesign efforts.</p> <p>No formal action was taken.</p> | |
| HRS Data Dashboard & 2025 State of the System Report | Joseph Montano | <p>Joseph Montano presented updates to the Homelessness Response System (HRS) data dashboard and shared key findings from the 2025 State of the System Report.</p> <p>Key highlights included system performance trends, identified gaps and needs, and data on racial disparities within the system.
